#### 1 Introduction

The Brier Creek Elementary staff, students and parents, and community leaders are committed to providing the safest environment possible. We recognize the possibility of a hostile attack, sabotage, or other violent action, as well as disaster/crisis resulting from fire, natural causes, or acts of school violence. As a public institution of learning, this county realizes the importance of and need to mitigate, provide for, and respond to emergency situations. The School Risk Management Planning Tool provides a framework in which the school can plan for and perform its respective emergency functions during school crisis situations. It is further designed to assist the staff in following procedures with the greatest possible speed and safety. Regardless of the prescribed procedures, training, and instruction, we acknowledge that the sound judgment of the administration and staff is an integral part of safety management. The safety and well-being of our students, staffs, and community members are of the utmost importance.

##### 1.1 Concept of Operations

Any incident occurring on Brier Creek school grounds while staff and students are present will be responded to initially by school personnel. The staff is expected to take charge and manage the incident until it is resolved or until the command is shifted to someone more qualified with legal authority to take command. In an incident the Principal or designee will activate the Crisis Management Plan. The principal or designee will contact the superintendent.

##### 1.2 Organization and Assignment of Responsibilities

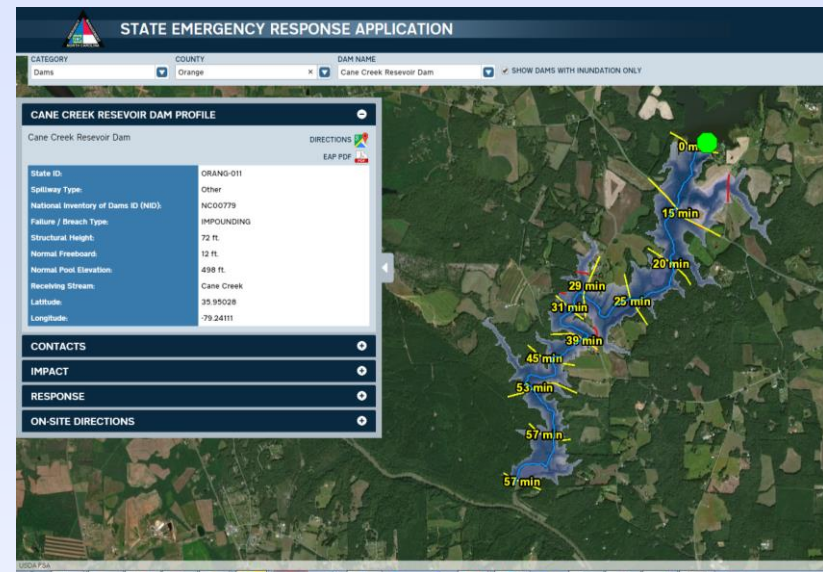
Brier Creek operational organization will facilitate the response to an incident. It contains information on the kinds of tasks to be performed by position and organization. It is essential that roles are known and accepted by staff members so smoother, more productive results will be achieved during an emergency.

Role	Responsibility
Principal	Provides for safety of students on daily basis. Coordinates response efforts with the Central Office/Superintendent's Office. As needed, delegates responsibility for certain tasks to qualified individuals.
School Resource Officer	The SRO at Brier Creek will facilitate communications.
Superintendent	Reports to the Principal to perform duties not directly involved in the supervision of students.
Assistant Principal	Provides for safety of students on daily basis.
Child Nutrition Supervisor	Provide food and water/drink as needed and perform other duties as needed.
Transportation Coordinator	Supervise the care of students if an emergency/disaster arises while students are on buses. Transport students as directed.
Maintenance Supervisor	Survey and report the condition of the building(s) and grounds to the Principal. During an event, report damage to the Incident Commander and manage all necessary shutoff valves, provide damage control as needed, and assist in the use and disbursement of supplies and equipment.

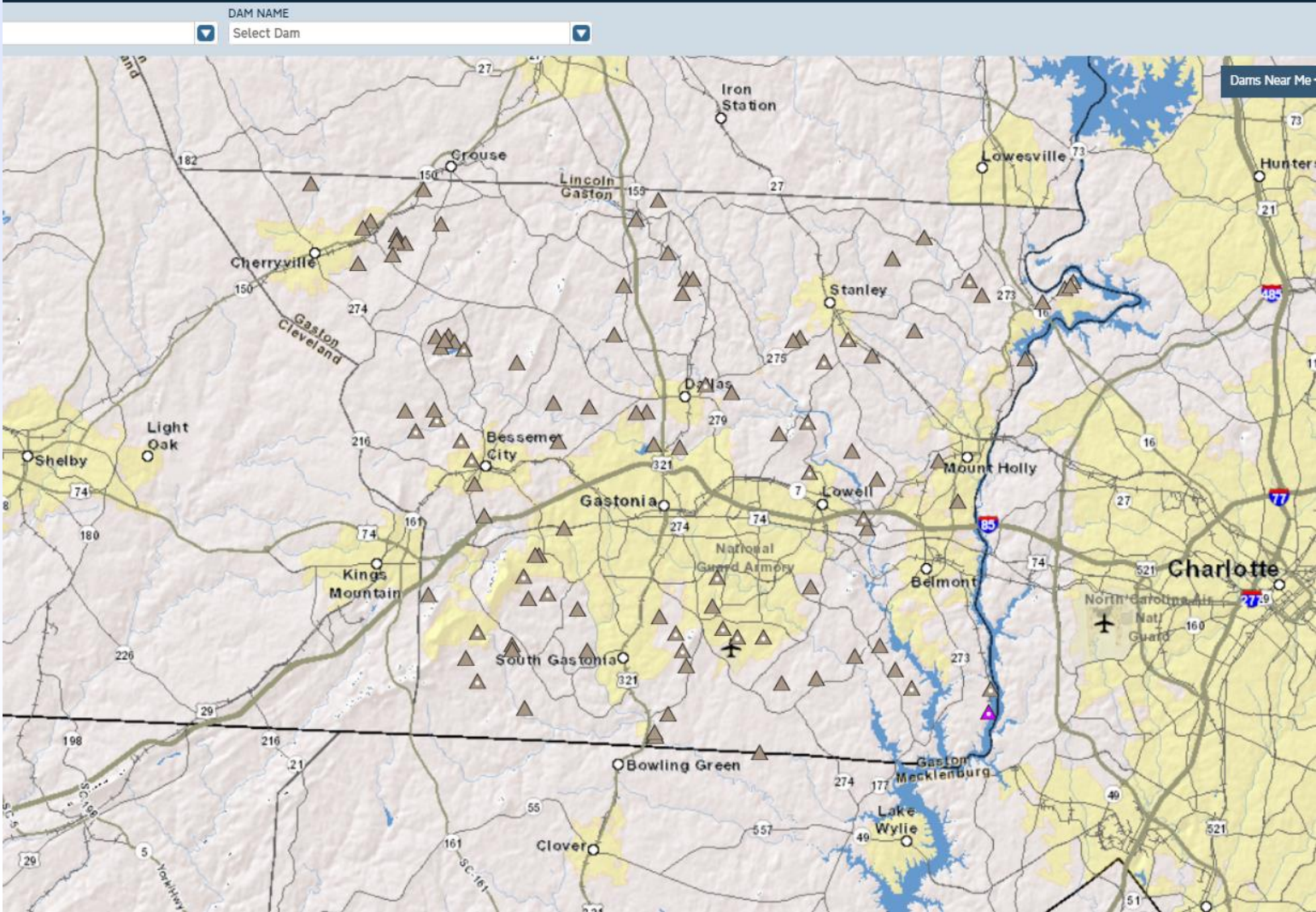

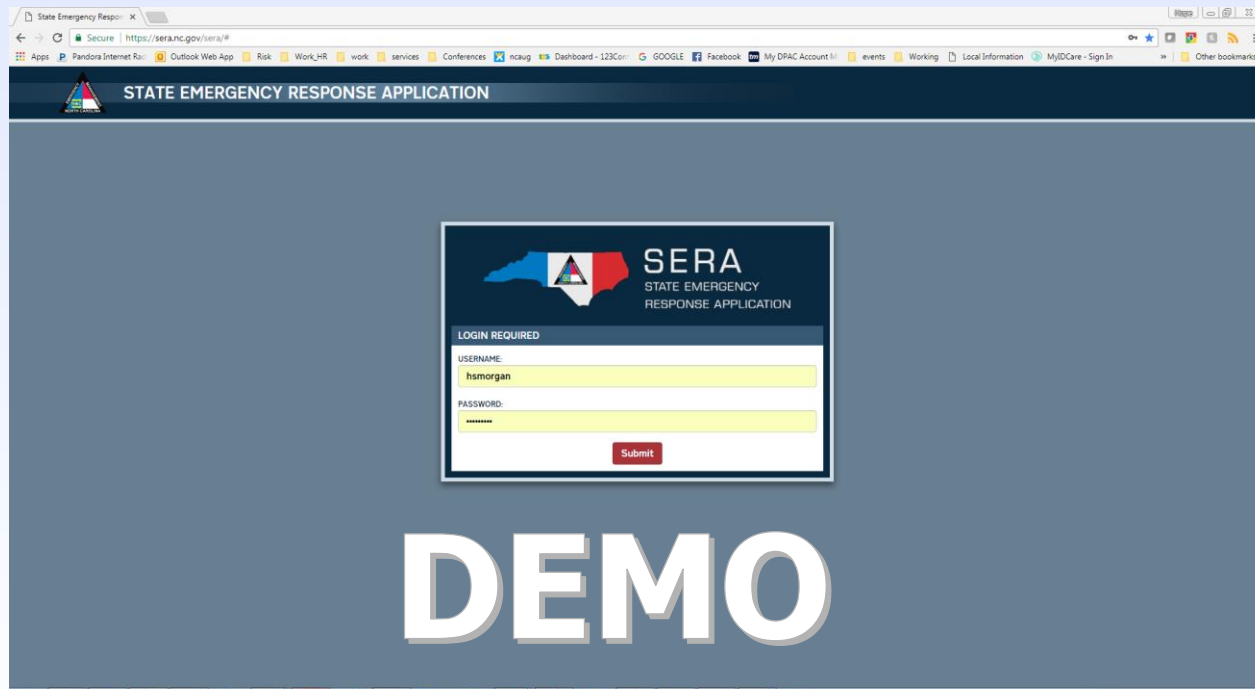

- The School Administrator will initiate appropriate immediate response actions, which may include shelter-in-place, evacuate building, or off-site evacuation.
- The School Administrator will call 911 and will describe the nature and extent of the flooding.
- The School Administrator will keep a battery-powered radio tuned to a local radio station for information.
- If the School Administrator issues evacuate building or off-site evacuation action, staff and students will evacuate affected buildings using prescribed routes or other safe routes to the designated assembly area.
- In the event of an evacuation, Teachers will bring their student roster and take attendance at the Assembly Area to account for students. Teachers will notify the School Administrator immediately of any missing students.
- The School Administrator will notify appropriate school district

# Summary of CFRMP Roles

## **Super Administrator:**

NC Office of Risk Management staff have permissions to the overall system for IT administration issues.

## **Facility Admin:**

have access to view all plans for the facility. Plans can be exported for review at any time. Use the Administration tool to search for users and assign them to plans.

## **Author:**

responsible for the oversight of the plan, including submitting the plan for review, and publishing the plan.

## **Contributors:**

can be assigned by the Author or above to any plan to assist with the data entry.

## **Reviewers:**

can comment on all pages of the plan. The plan becomes available for review after the data has been entered into the plan by the Authors and Contributors, and the Author has submitted the plan for review.

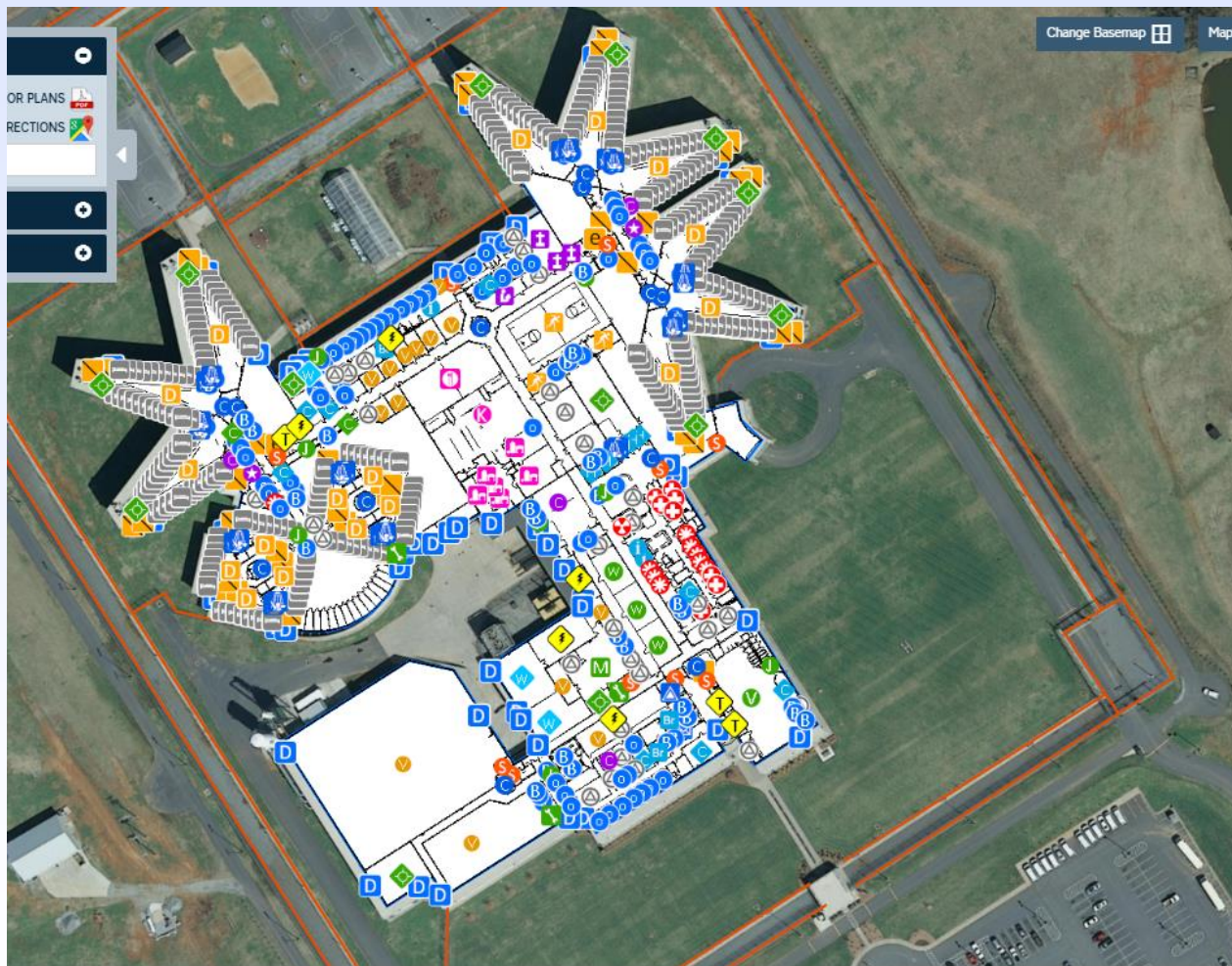

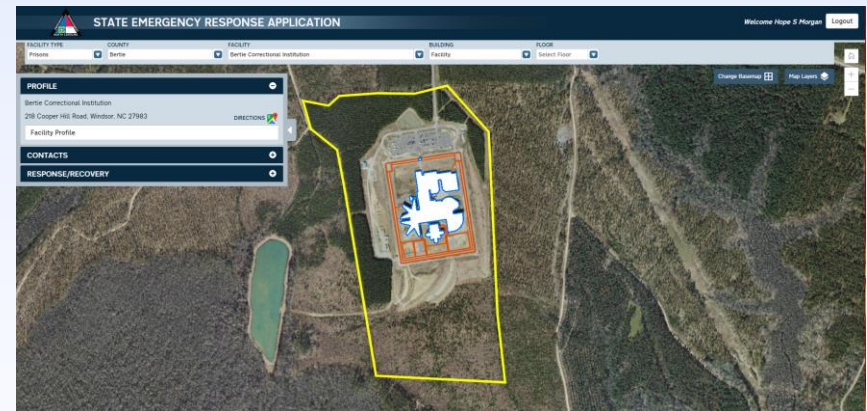

  - Number of intruders and any description
  - Number of known hostages
  - Type of weapon used
  - Any demands made
  - Number of known students/staff injured
  - Description of area
  - Staff should remain on the phone to provide updates and additional information.
  - Assume command in the office, if safe to do so.
  - Retrieve Critical Incident Response Kit (black box).
  - Account for all students/staff/visitors.
  - Wait for law enforcement who will initiate Rapid Deployment per State Guidelines.
3. Notify Superintendent/designee, Public Information Officer

# Upgrades and maintenance

2. Money to clean up some of the processes and assist with building maintenance.
3. Work with Power school to incorporate information

6. Upgrade the buildings that need to be added for all systems.

# Instructions for NCID Admins

# NCID Security

- County EM determines who has access for the SERA System.
- There is an administrator tool that provides access and is controlled by the County EM designee
- Plans are controlled by each school district within the planning tool.
- Must have an Active Agency NCID
- Must have a local or State Activity Type
- Must change the password every 90 days.

# **Instructions for adding or changing NCID Administrators for your county**

Someone from the county, preferably the person that will be the administrator, needs to open a ticket and request to be an administrator for the county. This person will need to include all the agencies for which they wish to have administrative privileges.

Once the ticket is received DIT will contact the county manager to describe the request and get a point of contact. It helps if prior to requesting the ticket, the person gives the county manager a heads up that NCID will be sending an email. For audit purposes we need an approval email from the current county manager. Once we receive the go ahead we will work with the contact to get an account promoted.

Once there is a top-level administrator that person can create and promote other accounts. NCID can assist with how to do that.

# Instructions for SERA Admin Tool

Who are your NCID delegated Admin? You need to make sure you have these people set up correctly with NCID. (if there are questions see step 1)

If you have access to NCID you can pull the existing list from NCID and adjust to work within the tool import.

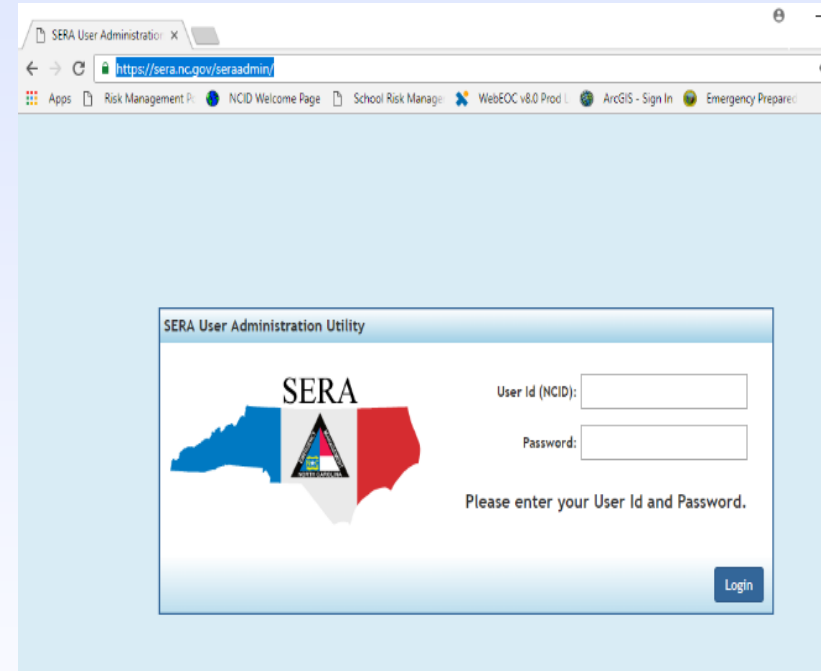

# Loading single users into SERA admin

- You must first have permission as an NCID Administrator from NC Risk Management. If a contact is provided we will add them as an administrator to the system.
- You would then be able to log into SERA and add users as the NCID Admin for your division



Once added to SERA as an admin the individual would have the ability to add users. This is by User ID, Last name, First name, or Email Address (first Button)

- Next is Type, this is either Contains, Begins with, Ends with, or exact Match
- Text field is where you would type in either the user ID, name, or email

# Bulk Upload tool on the SERA Admin site.

1. Create an Excel file containing all the people that you wish to add to the System. Adjust your list to include at least 2 columns of data. One column has to have the header NCID and has to contain NCID usernames of the users you want to add. Another column has to have the header FIPS with the corresponding FIPS codes (the county assigned) for the users. The excel file can have any name, and the file can have more than these two required columns, but these columns have to exist with the required data. If any username or FIPS code is wrong, it will generate an error message for that particular row.

a. If you are not the NCID Delegated admin for a user you are trying to add, it will generate an error for that user. Here is a snapshot of a file I created. The user 'aavsdsv' does not exist, so it will generate an error

# Bulk Upload tool on the SERA Admin site.

Click on 'Select Excel File' and navigate to the file containing the NCID and FIPS codes. Once the file is selected, click on the Upload File button. The rows will be processed, and you will see error messages, if any problems occur.

You can close the window and verify with some NCIDs you added (using Search) to see if the right user was added to the right county.
